

## **Belfield Public School Hybrid Plans**

The goal of the Belfield Public School District is to remain in level one as long as possible. We can only do that with the help of students, their families, our staff, and our community. With that in mind, please remember that these plans are subject to change.

### **Level One**

Face-to-Face instruction will take place Monday through Thursday with all students coming into the school. Friday is our virtual day. Teachers will have virtual and face-to-face office hours for students who need access to us. For students who want to meet with their teachers – whether it's virtually or face-to-face, parents and/or students need to reserve time during the teacher's office hours. Buses will not run on Friday, and lunch will not be served.

### **Level Two**

The student body will be split 50%. So, 50% of our students will come to school for face-to-face instruction on Mondays and Tuesdays while the other 50% will come into the school for face-to-face instruction on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Fridays are the same as level one. At this stage, preschool will be offered to morning students on Mondays and Tuesdays. Afternoon preschool students are able to attend on Wednesdays and Thursdays afternoons. Buses will not run on Friday, and lunch will not be served.

What moves the district into this level is contingent upon several factors included, but not limited to, confirmed positive cases, number of students, staff, and administration in quarantine, and who has been quarantined or infected. This will be closely monitored by administration in cooperation with our local health unit. We ask that families keep clear lines of communication open with us so that we can be as proactive and responsive as possible.

### **Level Three**

Students in K-4 will be split 50%, so 50% of our students in K-4 will come into school for face-to-face instruction on Mondays and Tuesdays while the other 50% will come into the school for face-to-face instruction on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Students in grades 5-12 will have their classes taught online. Students receiving special education are still welcome to come into the school to receive those services. Fridays are the same as level one. Buses will not run on Friday, and lunch will not be served.

In this stage, the district will look into providing technology to families who need them.

What moves the district into this level is contingent upon several factors included, but not limited to, confirmed positive cases, number of students, staff, and administration in quarantine, and who has been quarantined or infected. This will be closely monitored by administration in tangent with our local health unit. We ask that families keep clear lines of communication open with us so that we can be as proactive and responsive as possible.

**Level Four**

1-12 students are in distance education. Kindergarten students will come in for face-to-face instruction one day a week, so the rest of the days they will need to attend virtually. Morning preschool students can attend one morning a week while afternoon students are able to attend one afternoon a week. Busses will not run on Friday, and lunch will not be served.

In this stage, the district will look into providing technology to families who need them.

What moves the district into this level is contingent upon several factors included, but not limited to, confirmed positive cases, number of students, staff, and administration in quarantine, and who has been quarantined or infected. This will be closely monitored by administration in cooperation with our local health unit.
